



Landscape Character



Worthington's highest points, Bashan Hill (2,033 ft) and Knowles Hill (2,011 ft), are in the northwest portion of town. From there, the landscape slopes to the southwest along a high ridgeline and a large plateau region, ending in the southwest corner and the lowlands of South Worthington and Jackson Swamp. Steep slopes fall from the ridges into the river valleys, especially the nationally-designated *Wild and Scenic* Middle Branch of the Westfield River on the western border of town.
