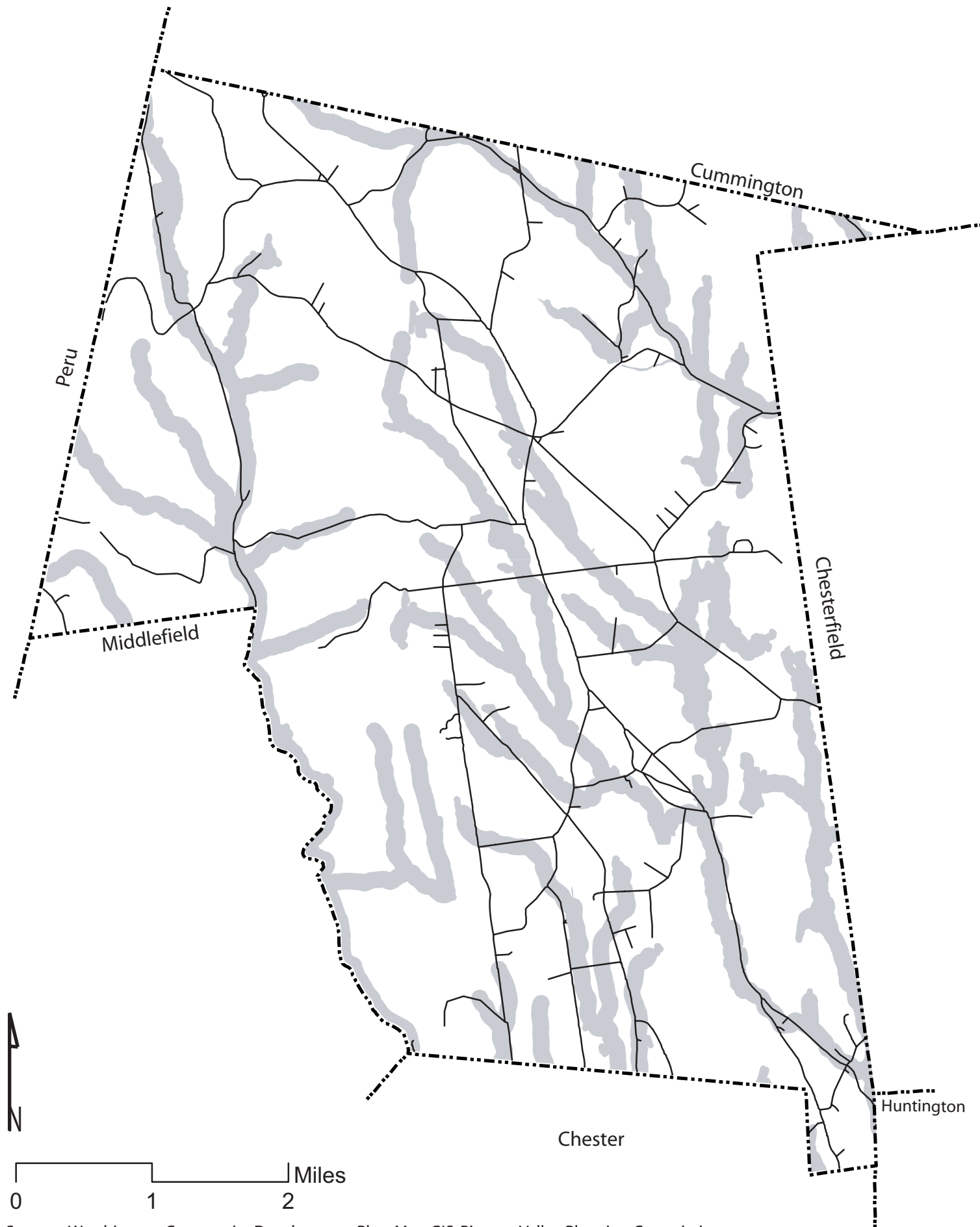
# Riparian Corridors

---

Riparian corridors are valuable resources for protecting water quality, providing wildlife habitat, linking habitats, and maintaining biodiversity.

These corridors follow the deep valleys and run mainly in a north-south direction.

Riparian plant species in Worthington include red maple, butternut, black ash, arrowhead, and willows.



 **Riparian Corridors**

Corridors include rivers, streams, ponds, wetlands, and the 200-foot buffer protected by the River Protection Act and the Wetland Protection Act.
