And we asked Julia if she could give us some sense and she said she wasn't, I interpreted it, she wasn't comfortable talking without the whole group talking

because it's a really fun.

So I think I've said this before, the language they're proposing is broad, it covers all of Worthington and it doesn't really make a case for the things that we feel the AG's office care about, which is safety, health, and welfare.

And so to my read, looking at the other moratoriums that have been proposed that have all been rejected by the AG's office in the last couple of years, it's very unlikely that it will pass, muster the AG's office.

So we're trying to develop a language to have another bylaw, another moratorium on the same hearing, same town meeting warrant that is sort of modeled on the Hadley large-scale energy storage system amendment that they passed last fall and got AG's approval this spring.

And it says that, so in general in Hadley, they allow solar in their residential agricultural district and their industrial district, which is most of the town.

42:20 - 42:27

Selectboard Office

They do have a commercial district along Route 9 And they have a little tiny residential district in the middle of the residential agriculture district.

42:28 - 42:33

Selectboard Office

And they have a couple other little things, but residential agriculture is the vast majority.

42:33 - 42:35

Selectboard Office

Industrial is along the Amherst line.

42:36 - 42:39

Selectboard Office

And so solar is allowed throughout that space.

42:40 - 42:47

Selectboard Office

And the amendment last fall was to define large energy storage systems.

42:47 - 42:48

Selectboard Office

That's their term.

42:48 - 42:52

Selectboard Office

And that's anything over 150 megawatts.

42:52 - 43:02

Selectboard Office

Sorry, 150 kilowatts, which is a pretty, you know, I think the point there is a residential battery isn't going to be that big.

43:02 - 43:09

Selectboard Office

150 kilowatts is small for a large solar, like the ones we're looking at are 1 to 2 megawatts.

43:09 - 43:17

Selectboard Office

So it's not a crazy big and it's not crazy small either, right?

43:17 - 43:18

Selectboard Office

It's felt like that's reasonable.

43:19 - 43:43

So anything over that is considered large energy storage, and they restrict, they prohibit such things in their water supply district, which is the two aquifers under the residential agricultural district, which are, I don't have percentages, but it's a big chunk of the middle of the town is therefore batteries are excluded.

They also exclude them from within 300 feet of a residential unit, and they limit them to five megawatts.

43:52 - 43:55

So all those things pass muster with the AG's office.

And so we're kind of saying, well, it worked for Hadley.

Can we come up with a bylaw amendment?

44:05 - 44:11

Selectboard Office

I think we're all kind of struggling with what's a moratorium and what's just amended bylaws.

44:11 - 44:13

Selectboard Office

And it is vague.

44:13 - 44:22

Selectboard Office

I think the point for me, the moratorium is just something we can do really quickly, whereas the actual amendment might be a lot more nuanced.

44:22 - 44:30

So this is sort of like, let's just try to get something that we think will pass that will offer some protection in these places that we feel are delicate.

44:31 - 44:40

And so I did some mapping, looking at the watershed for the Westfield, looking at the wellhead protection areas.

Selectboard Office

I have this awkward thing where I can't, I've been asking PVPC for why is our water supply protection district, why is it that line?

Selectboard Office

Because it doesn't, I don't know what caused that line to be drawn.

44:55 - 44:57

Selectboard Office

The wellhead protection areas are much smaller.

44:59 - 45:02

Selectboard Office

So far I don't have an answer for the bigger line.

So I think the ultimate map should include that, should include the Westfield drainage is that's all considered as surface water, public water supply, and we put in the biomap three, which is a joint project between the State and Nature Conservancy to look at critical habitat.

They have two levels.

45:30 - 45:32

One is the core and one is the critical.

45:33 - 45:34

Selectboard Office

The critical is around the core.

45:34 - 45:41

Selectboard Office

The map just draft that I drew just had the core, but I think it could be reasonable to include the critical.

45:41 - 45:45

Selectboard Office

So it trying to say, these are the areas in town.

45:45 - 45:56

Selectboard Office

Oh, and then we added 300 feet around every structure because residential, I don't have that ability that easily.

45:56 - 46:10

Selectboard Office

So we made this map and the point of doing it was to do sort of an analysis of how much of the, percentage of the town does that leave available for solar or exclude solar or batteries, right?

46:11 - 46:12

Selectboard Office

We'll come to that.

46:12 - 46:31

Selectboard Office

And the whole reason for that is that no one knows how much you can limit solar specifically in towns, how much towns can limit it, but they know that only allowing it in percent of the town was rejected by the Supreme Judicial Court.

So you can, you can allow it in 100% of your town, you can't deny it, you know, you can't only allow it in 2%.

Somewhere in between is this magic number.

So what was the answer when you map that out?

How much of the town was left?

So just looking at the biomap and water, you get amazingly close to 50, I think it's 50.3% would be excluded from whatever.

When you add the structures, it's 63% is protected.

47:03 - 47:04

Selectboard Office

So there are a lot of 36% of them.

47:06 - 47:12

Selectboard Office

Did you look at how much of that 36% is actually viable for solar now?

So much of it is the west side of town.

It's that drainage, a lot of that is state land, which I don't see them putting solar on the state land, but it does protect it, but it includes you and I, right?

We're down, the bottom of Kinney Brook is draining down there, so that whole sort of southern part of town, not the 112 side, but whatever that we are, the southwest corner is all covered by those maps.

Obviously, when you add the structure setbacks, then all the roads are kind of, they have a roughly 600 foot buffer or 300 feet on each side, kind of thing.

So you start sort of seeing, like the Jones lot sort of stands out, right?

And that's an interesting, the Jones lot is APR land, solar is only allowed on APR if If it's being used on site, you can do 200% of your current usage.

So it's kind of already protected and kind of isn't, I don't know.

That's a tough one.

Selectboard Office

I think for me, the motivator has been a reasonable case that the human health will be harmed by some sort of leakage into that water.

And so one of the things we talked about in the meeting today was, should we include all water bodies in all wetlands?

And I think that I'm going to make a map that shows it.

But I think as soon as you go into the critical versus core, or you go into the all wetlands, or then you start putting buffers around wetlands, at some point, you cross the line.

I do wonder if we might – so one of the things – I think the outcome of our meeting today is that we're going to actually have two proposed moratoriums, one for solar and one for energy storage, whether it's battery or whatever, because I think those two maps are different.

And so we might come up with a map that limits solar, like in the core biomass core areas, but limits batteries in the critical area, right, so that basically you just put a bigger setback for batteries because they're more risky.

I think that there are arguments, I think, for keeping solar out of, like I was pondering that whole western slope to the Westfield and like no one I've talked to, very few people I've talked to have thought that solar panels by themselves are a threat to the water supply but that whole side or much of it is forested and so going and clear-cutting 30 acres to put solar in would definitely have an impact on the water supply and so can we have the sort of the solar side of it be that we it but we don't allow tree cutting or we could allow a very small amount of tree cutting so that it is effectively prohibiting it be open that we're effectively prohibiting it but but have it grounded in this idea that it's not the solar that's the threat it's the tree cutting that's the threat.

Well do we prohibit tree cutting now aside from the solar?

I know there's you might have better answers than me.

The two existing.

They did cut trees.

I got a call from the logger who did the scene, saying he wasn't really aware that

what he was doing was part of this sort of prepping, and Brisson, he's my neighbor, I witnessed him clear that whole lot.

Whether they had to get permits, I don't know.

Selectboard Office

The Brisson property, in my mind, they may actually have violated the Wetlands Protection Act because they came mighty close to the stream in that pond down in that area.

But I don't know if there's an exemption for agriculture.

He is definitely agriculture.

As a farmer, I can cut up to some board fee without getting a without filing a cutting plan but if I hire someone to do it they have to file a cutting plan there's a whole review.

So I think there are restrictions.

I think if, you know, I'll point to you because I know you own land that's forested in that area.

If you wanted to clear cut 30 acres, I don't know.

I think you probably could do it ultimately, but you would have to jump through a bunch of hoops.

Same with me.

I think we would have to, we'd have to show but I think if it was involved wetlands, the conservation commission would need to be looking at it, but you'd get close.

But, and also I think that those projects at that scale, they're really looking at water flow and erosion control.

So that's why you have to file the cutting plan.

You know Surface water certainly I think it's worth the try they may kick it back and say look This is already covered by all these regulations that you guys are blowing smoke and making it hard for solar and you shouldn't Discriminate a good solar because a lot of people can do it, too.

Personally, I feel like it's worth a try, but I think This is this is the challenge is that solar is protected.

It's a protected use and it's really hard to find ways to say it's not but On the other hand, towns change the law, change the state law, but it is also the case that towns have defined overlay districts where they allow solar and that excludes solar from other places and that is acceptable.

I would think typically it's in a town where there's where they've zoned residential versus agricultural.

It's a lot easier at that point.

Obviously did not have industrial solar in a residential.

The industrial scale ones, they get, it's different, but those have real value, and that is actually, at least my perception is, that's why private equity is interested in these projects, is that they want those tax credits.

And those, I believe I'm right, that the individual tax credits went away, but those commercial tax credits haven't quite yet, but they're gonna go away.

And so there is a real question, when those disappear, what happens?

One theory which is plausible but interesting is that the developers are gonna say, looked without that federal tax credit, this stuff isn't worth it to us.

You, state governor, feel that this stuff's really important.

We can't develop it without them, so we should be exempt from local taxation,

which is awesome.

It's an interesting argument for a pilot agreement, because that's a negotiated thing that's separate.

The other is the – we – I don't know what I keep saying.

That program has been sort of – I don't know – replaced something with the smart program, which is vastly more complicated, and I don't really understand it, but that's best I understand.

And so there's a whole sort of incentive structure.

The one I'm aware of is that this is an agrivoltaic system and they get an incentive for doing that.

They'll get as an additional, basically they're, I don't know, I'm going to say, their SREC is worth more, because the state said it was, because the state controls the marketplace, and because they're doing agrivoltaics.

And the reason for that, I think, from the state's perspective is ag land is really easy to put solar on.

And so the solar companies are happy to do that.

And it's not a great plan for the state to lose all of its ag land to solar.

And so MDR worked and came up with this set of specs that's agroaltaics, that says you can farm under the solar panels and so you get this dual use projects and they said, you know, we're basically reducing the density of panels on that piece of land to half what it would be for some standard commercial.

And so to encourage companies to still do it, they had to increase the payment and it kind of makes up for the reduction in density of the panels.

That's the goal anyway.

It has the rider that if they don't farm it, if they can't contract a farmer, if that piece of land isn't farmed, they lose the adder.

So there's incentive for them to keep someone out there mowing cutting hay.

I don't know.

So, and there's very little, I mean, there is zoning that exists that you can.

Because the trees are going to come back the trouble with the solar is once they commission their sites.

Which is what the poles?
